# New Approaches to reporting of Gel Adherence in Microbicide Trials

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### **Rationale: 035 Adherence Reports High**

- In 035 women report high rates of adherence to gel and condoms at follow-up
- Compared to rates of condom use from national surveys these numbers appear high
- Raises concerns about potential overreporting of gel and condom use in faceto-face interviews (FTFI)

# Why Measuring Adherence a Challenge

Adherence difficult to measure in microbicide trials because:

Products not absorbed

Participants may be unwilling to report gel non-use to interviewers

Participants may be embarrassed to report about sexual behavior to interviewers

# Why Have Alternative to FTFI?

- Mode of data collection previously shown to affect reports of sensitive behaviors
- Goal is to maximize accuracy of compliance reports in clinical trials &
- To increase participants comfort and willingness to report sensitive behavior such as non-use of gel or not following protocol
- Audio computer assisted self interviewing (ACASI) may increase reporting of sensitive behaviors.

### **Research Objectives: 035b**

<u>1</u>: Assess feasibility of using ACASI to collect data on gel adherence and condom use in MTN trials

<u>2</u>: Determine whether ACASI yields higher reports of non-adherence to gel and condom use and a higher number of sexual partners

3: Identify predictors of discrepancies in FTFI and ACASI reports

# **Proposed Study Design (N=400)**


- Add a short ACASI measure of gel use and sexual behavior to 035 (10 questions) administered with headphones for privacy
- 10 of the questions on gel use from 035 questionnaire will be included with a question on preference of interview mode
- Graphic response format allows all women to be able to participate
- Will be filled out AFTER the FBA questionnaire is completed by interview

# Why Handhelds

• Take up less space in busy clinics than desktops

 Run on batteries so do not need steady power source

• Less intimidating to participants who have never used a computer

 Allows data checking – between questions - built-In

•Audio & image options



# **Potential ACASI Graphics**

The last time you had vaginal sex: did you use study gel?



'YES'



In the past 3 months, how many sex partners have you had?



The number will increase each time the woman presses the image

# **Potential ACASI Graphics**

In the past week, how many times did you use a male or female condom and not the study gel during vaginal sex?

In the past week, how many times did you use study gel and not a male or female condom during vaginal sex?



Do you prefer answering questions to the computer/ machine or to a person?

- ACASI data will be downloaded onto desktop computers from the hand-held devices on a daily basis
- A program to convert the data into a format that will fill in the boxes on a CRF form similar to the forms currently used in 035 is in development
- The CRF forms will be printed and faxed to SCHARP for entry into the database

- ACASI shown in other studies to increase reporting of sensitive behaviors – not a new concept but new to clinical trials
- ACASI in developing country contexts is feasible – we will test its feasibility in a clinical trial context
- Alternatives to face-to-face interviews may enhance accuracy of reported adherence in MTN trials

### **Final Points**

- Study has separate budget sites will receive some funding for participating to cover extra costs required to conduct the study
